Eminence begins its suite of concerts in Melbourne with Spirited Away with Youmi. Held in Melbourne Town Hall on Sunday the 2nd of July at 12pm and Sydney Town Hall on Thursday 6th of July 2006, 7:30pm, the Japanese singer and lyre performer will perform selected pieces from Studio Ghibli films including Spirited Away, Princess Mononoke and My Neighbour Totoro. Celebrate the Japanese Tanabata Festival in style with Youmi! The festival is normally held on July 7th or August 7th, and celebrates the



meeting of Orihime and Hikoboshi who were separated by the Milky Way. The two lovers were only allowed to meet once a year and this is celebrated in present day Japan by writing wishes on tanzaku (small pieces of paper) and hanging them on bamboo.

At the concert the audience will be able to write their own wishes for Tanabata, and Youmi Kimura will draw some at random to win prizes! Eminence wishes to encourage the community to not only learn about Japanese culture, but to become involved in it. Make sure you write your wish at the concert!



About 'Spirited Away'



'Spirited Away' released in 2001 by the Japanese anime studio Studio Ghibli, directed by famed animator Hayao Miyazaki. Spirited Away is arguably the most famous anime film of all time. Many Studio Ghibli films have rivaled it's popularity in Japan, yet no previous anime film has attracted such a wide audience and universal acclaim across the globe. The film was named Best Animated Feature at the 75th Academy Awards. It was the first anime film to win an Academy Award, and notably it won a Best Animated Feature Oscar before any other traditionally hand-drawn films. In fact, no hand-drawn film has ever won the award. Shrek, the first winner, was made from CGI animation.

Users of the Internet Movie Database have voted the film among "The Top 250 Rated Films" as well as "The Top Rated Animation Title.

Spirited Away follows the fanciful adventures of a ten-year old girl named 'Chihiro', who discovers a secret world when she and her parents get lost and venture through a hillside tunnel. After her parents undergo a mysterious transformation, Chihiro must fend for herself as she encounters





strange spirits, assorted creatures and grump sorceress who seeks to prevent her from returning to the human world. Chihiro embarks on a journey that sees her assume adult responsibilities and set aside her self-centeredness for the good of others. With the support of her friends, she is introduced to a world without the shelter of parents and must adapt to survive!

FINAL FANTASY is one of the best-selling video game franchises in the world, with more than 60 million units sold worldwide. The first FINAL FANTASY was released in 1987 in Japan and 1990 in North America. Spanning multiple platforms, the long-running series has introduced the world of cinematic role-playing games (RPGs) to millions of gamers around the globe.

An accomplished composer and musician, Nobuo Uematsu has

About Studio Ghibli

Studio Ghibli Inc. is a Japanese animation film studio,

Founded in 1985, it is headed by the acclaimed director <u>Hayao</u> <u>Miyazaki</u> along with his colleague and mentor <u>Isao Takahata</u>, as well as the studio's executive managing director and long-time



producer <u>Toshio Suzuki</u>. Its origins date back to <u>1983</u>, with the film <u>Nausicaä of the Valley of Wind</u>, which was popularised as a serialized <u>manga</u> in a publication of <u>Tokuma Shoten</u>'s <u>Animage</u> magazine after the original screenplay was rejected. The film was eventually produced by Topcraft and the film's success spurred the formation of Ghibli. Tokuma is the parent company of Studio

Ghibli, and has provided <u>Disney</u> with the video rights to eight of the films and global distribution rights to <u>Princess Mononoke</u> and <u>Spirited</u>



<u>Away</u>. Miyazaki's latest film, <u>Howl's Moving Castle</u>, was actually based on a book by



British author <u>Diana Wynne Jones</u>, published in several countries including Canada and the United States. Composer <u>Joe Hisaishi</u> has provided the soundtrack for all of Miyazaki's Studio Ghibli films.
